# E-Vote: After School Dungeons and Dragons Club

Motion: To approve a D+D Club, as described below by M. Klein. Moved by: Ms. Dixon

As you know, I have multiple passions. I'm passionate about teaching, but I love theater, storytelling, writing, any art and creative work and many more...

I am interested in bringing yet another one of my passions to school: role playing games. I would like to start a Dungeons and Dragons club here at school. I will start this project with my class and I might, later on, extend it to other classes.

Some might ask me "What is a role-playing game?" It's a game where the players evolve in a make-believe world (in my case, it will be the D&D fantasy setting), and cooperate together to complete quests. It has strategies like chess, characters to impersonate like improv or theater and it's a whole lot of fun. This game is played by students and I will be the Game Master, explaining to the players how the world reacts to their decisions or what happens in the character's adventures.

I recommend this game to all. It promotes problem solving, imagination, cooperation at its best and it's absolutely great for shy students who learn to open up and be a part of an adventuring team. It's a great way to practice French as well!

Once my players get good, I will teach them how to be Game Masters: how to build a scenario and make their world alive.

The sessions will be on Wednesdays and Thursdays afterschool, at 2:40 in my class (11). The sessions will be one hour long. Some adventures may take more than one session to complete! Since I would like to reach out and play with as many students as possible, I will be doing game sessions for grades 3, 4, 5 and 6. Teachers will give me the names of the children interested, and it will be on a first come, first serve basis. I will keep you posted. I can have a maximum of 6 players per grade to begin with. Of course, you would have to do the transportation, and please pick up your child on time.

Grade 4: May 9th, 23rd and June 13th

Grade 5: May 15th, 29th and June 19th

Grade 6: May 16th, 30th and June 20th

There will be no cost for this activity.

#### T-Shirt Purchase Plan for Next Year
